Therapon J. Parker, 1929:12, junior homonym of *Therapon* Cloquet, 1819. Type species: *Stictia chilensis* Eschscholz, 1822, by original designation and monotypy.

Zyzyx Pate, 1937c:68. Substitute name for *Therapon* J. Parker, 1929.

Stictia chilensis Eschscholz, 1823:150, ♀. Objective synonym of *Stictia chilensis* Eschscholz, 1822.

Bembex peruviana Guérin-Méneville, 1835:pl. 70, Fig. 6, ♂. Holotype: ♂, Peru: no specific locality (Genova). Synonymized with *Monedula chilensis* by Handlirsch, 1890:132. – Guérin-Méneville, 1844:436 (description); Guiglia, 1948b:179 (type in Genova). – **As *Monedula peruviana***: F. Smith, 1856:333 (new combination, listed); Sichel, 1867:142 (Chile).

Bembex chilensis Dahlbom, 1844:184, ♀ (authorship attributed to Klug). Holotype or syntypes: ♀, Chile: no specific locality (Lund or Stockholm). Synonymized with *Monedula chilensis* (Eschscholz) by Handlirsch, 1890:132.— Casolari and Casolari Moreno, 1980:115 (specimens in M. Spinola collection).

Monedula orbignyi Guérin-Méneville, 1844:437, ♀ (as *Orbignyi*, incorrect original capitalization). Syntypes: ♀, Argentina: La Plata and Patagonia: no specific locality (Genova and Leiden). Synonymized with *Monedula peruviana* by F. Smith, 1856:333. – Burmeister, 1874:116 (unknown to the author, taxonomic history, as *d'Orbignyi*); Guiglia, 1948b:180 (type in Genova); van der Vecht, 1957a:28 (type material in RMNH).

? *Monedula odontomera* Handlirsch, 1890:134, ♂. Holotype: ♂, origin unknown, but South America (HAMBURG, destroyed in World War II). – Dalla Torre, 1897:498 (in catalog of world Sphecidae); Bohart and Menke, 1976:550 (as tentative synonym of *Zyzyx chilensis*).
